



Weather Procedures

Lightning:

If there is lightning in the area that is deemed unsafe, you will hear one loud blast via air horn. We currently follow OSA guidelines using the 30/30 rule. The 30/30 Rule states that people should seek shelter if the "Flash-To-Bang" delay (length of time in seconds between a lightning flash and its subsequent thunder), is 30 seconds or less, and that they remain under cover until 30 minutes after the final clap of thunder. Use a "flash to bang" (lightning to thunder) count of five seconds equals one mile (10 = 2 miles; 20 = 4 miles; 30 = 6miles).

If this occurs, then everyone must exit the fields and wait in your cars.

Even with the above guidelines, if lightning is seen, we leave the fields.

3 short blasts signal game play may resume.

Severe Weather:

If a tornado warning is issued in or around our complex, one long blast of the air horn will be sounded to clear complex.

We will do our best to pre-warn coaches of severe storms heading our way, so everyone can be prepared or make the decision to leave sooner.

Missing Child Procedures

Child Find:

If there is a missing child, notify a staff member or concession immediately.

Staff Members:

1. Sound the air horn (3 long blasts)
2. Immediately close all gates to complex entrances/exits and await police or all clear signal.
3. Send Volunteers to wooded area on south side of complex to monitor and deny exiting until all clear is sounded
4. Obtain detailed description of child: name, sex, clothing, height, weight and last seen
5. Call 911
6. Notify all referees and initiate search of entire complex, including rest rooms, concession stand, maintenance sheds and parking lots.
7. When child is found, sound all clear with one long blast of air horn
